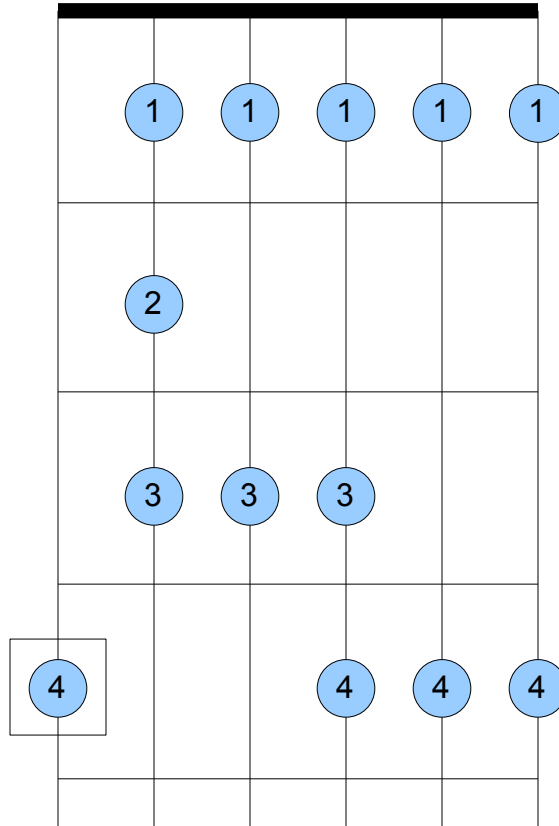



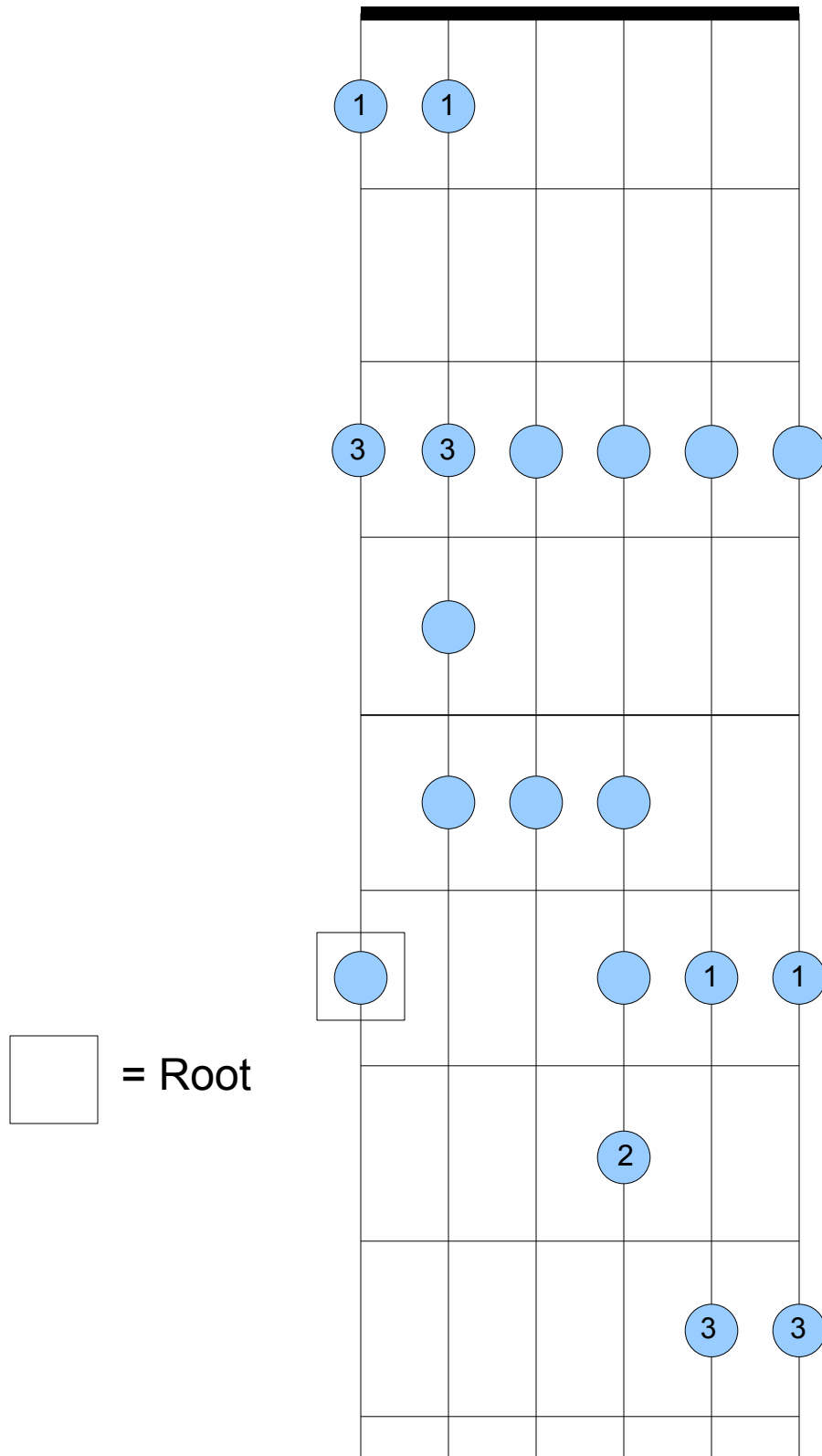
E Root Country Fingering



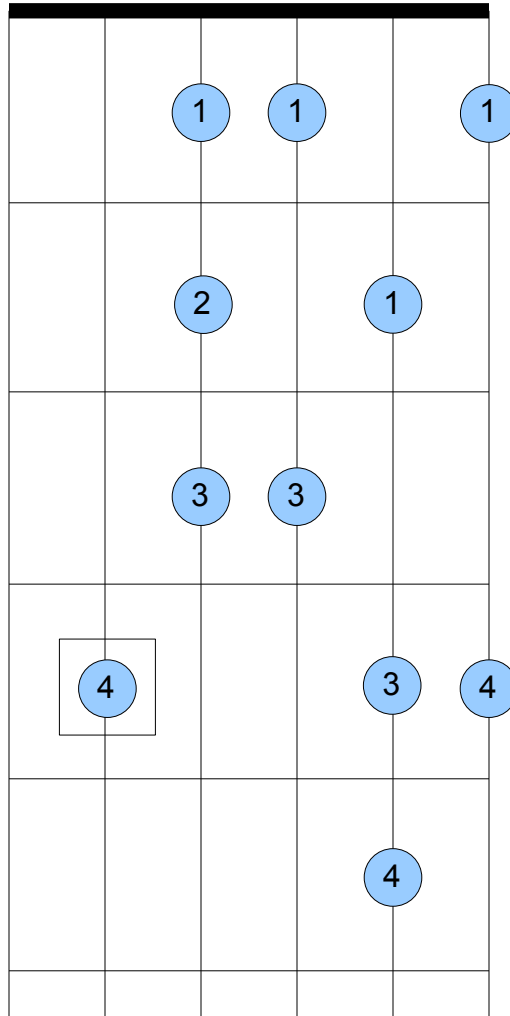
 = Root


You can play the Country scale over any chord progression that has a Major chord as the tone center. The root of this Country fingering is placed where the tone center is located on the E string.

E Root Extended Country Fingering



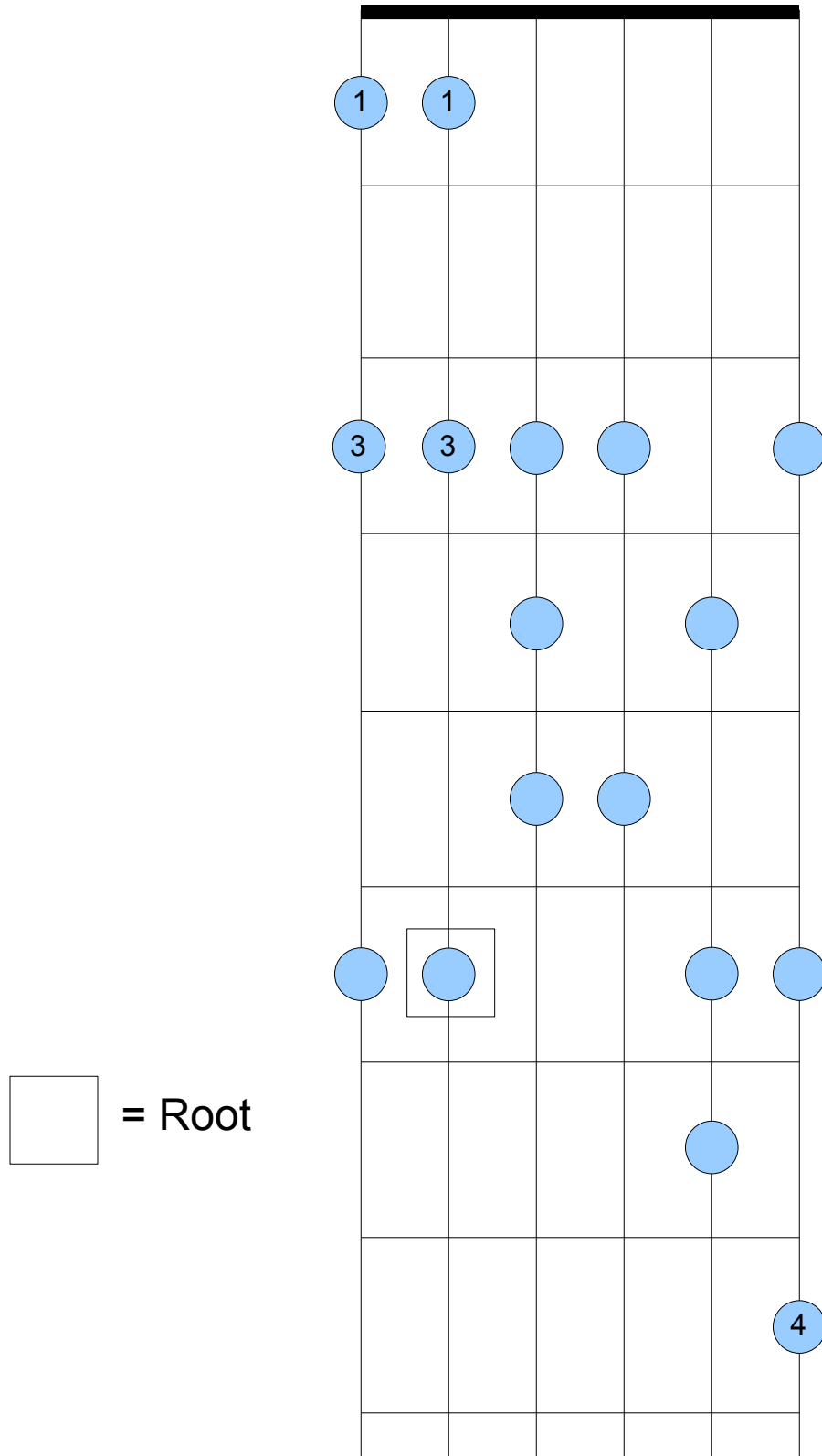
A Root Country Fingering



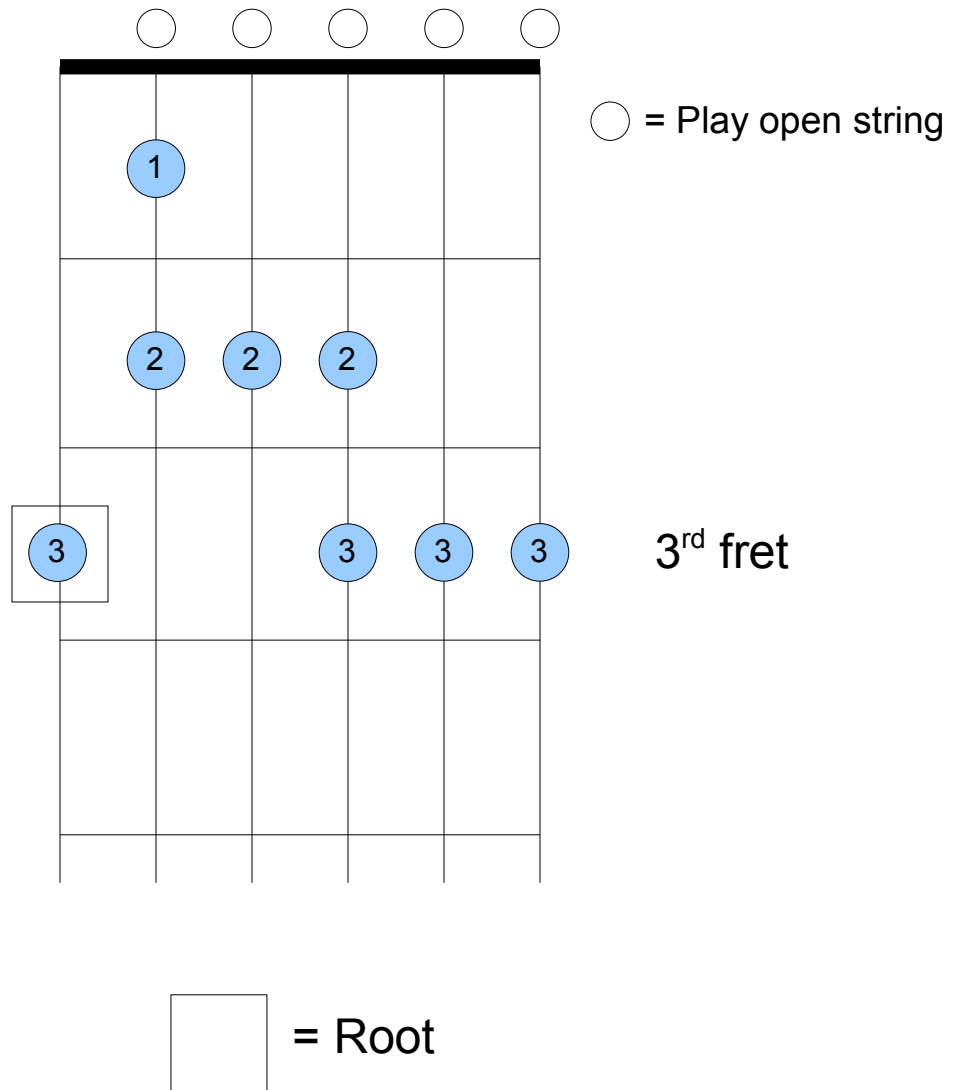
 = Root

The root of this Country fingering is placed where the tone center is located on the A string. Remember, the tone center of the chord progression should be a major chord when you play the country scale.

A Root Extended Country Fingering

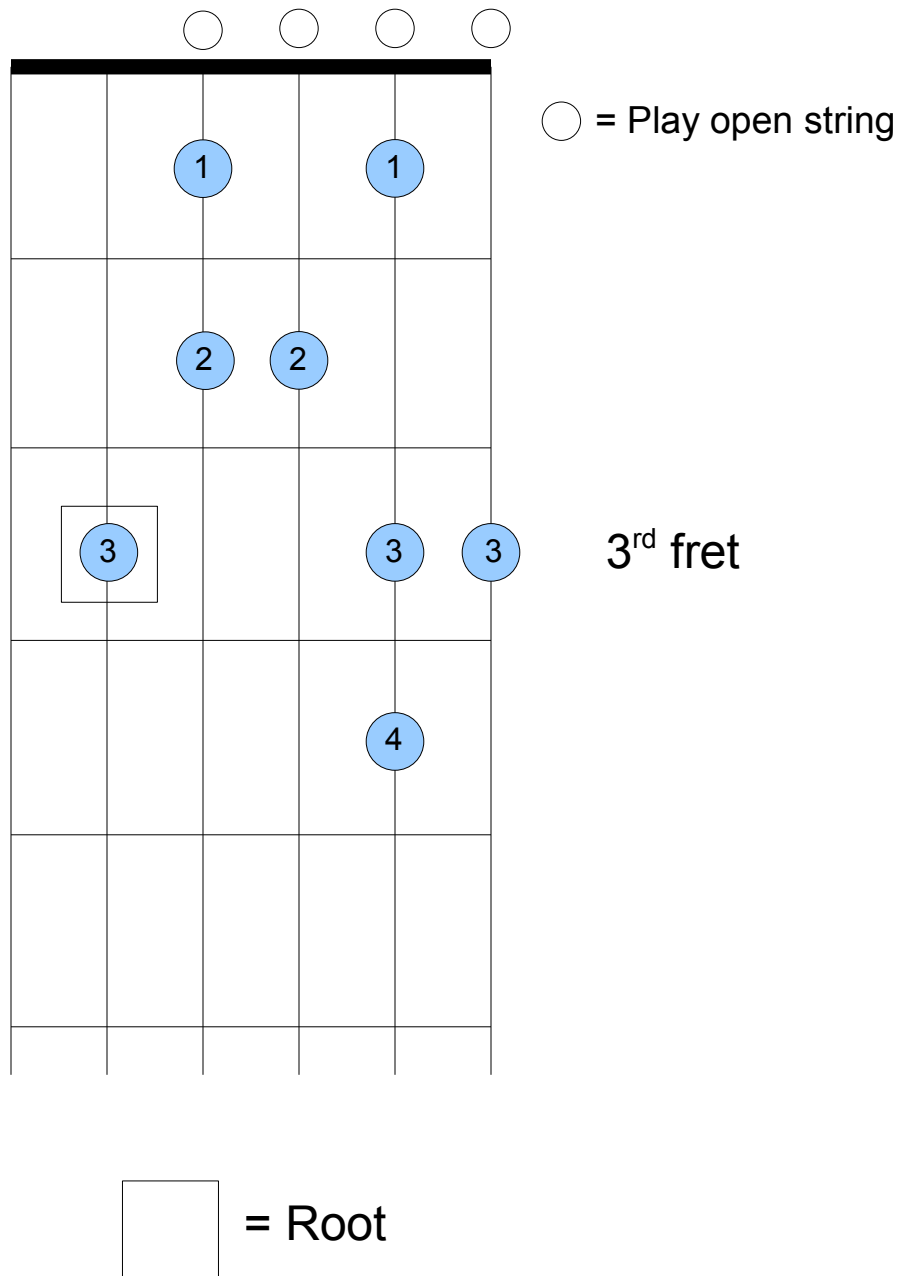


G Open String Country Fingering



This is a G country scale because the root is the G note on the 3rd fret of the low E string. Does this scale pattern look familiar? The E root country scale fingering shown earlier is based on this open string fingering.

C Open String Country Fingering



This is a C country scale because the root is the C note on the 3rd fret of the A string. This scale fingering should look familiar too. The A root country fingering shown earlier is based on this open string fingering.
